Preventing A Measles Outbreak

Measles is one of the most contagious virus known to infect humans. To put this in perspective, nine out of ten susceptible individuals exposed to measles will be infected. Measles infection is a serious disease that can lead to severe complications, including death. Those most at risk are young children, pregnant women, and those with weakened immune systems.

Symptoms include fever, tiredness, runny nose, cough, and pink eye, followed two to four days later by a rash. Although measles is usually considered a childhood disease, it can be contracted and cause severe illness at any age. Measles spreads easily through the air when an infected person breathes, coughs, or sneezes and can remain infectious in the air or on surfaces for up to two hours - meaning you can be infected even without direct contact with a sick individual . People can spread it before they even realize they are ill with more than just a common cold.

Although Nebraska is not experiencing a measles outbreak and there are no current cases in Nebraska. Our neighbors to the South, Southwest Kansas has 37 measles cases as of April 23rd. Three cases were appropriately vaccinated, one case not properly vaccinated, thirty one measles cases occurred in unvaccinated individuals, and two cases were unable to verify vaccination. By age groups, children age 0 - 4 had ten cases, Children ages 5 - 17 had 20 cases, and adults 18+ have had seven measles cases.

Nebraska's measles plan is to prevent the disease from entering Nebraska by making sure we maintain a 95% vaccination rate. Thus far, two children have died in Texas out of 480 cases, due to measles and two in New Mexico have died due to measles complications. The best method of preventing an outbreak in Nebraska is to make sure we are all vaccinated with the MMR vaccine.

"The MMR vaccine has been used for decades and has an excellent safety record. Just one does is 93% effective, and two doses are 97% effective. A community must maintain 95% immunity against measles to stop an outbreak, which is why it is critical for all Nebraskans and their families to receive the MMR vaccine," said DHHS Chief Medical Officer Dr. Timothy Tesmer. "Measles is a preventable disease. Without vaccination, it can spread quickly and dangerously. The potential side effect of measles is brain swelling, known as encephalitis, which can be deadly. If you are interested in receiving the MMR vaccine for either yourself or your children, please reach out to your health care provider or your local health department."

"Our goal is to prevent cases from showing up in our State and to ensure the protection of our kids, families and communities," said Gov. Pillen. "When it comes to measles, vaccination is the most effective tool available." Please take steps to prevent measles from spreading to our school by ensuring your children are properly vaccinated with the MMR vaccine.
