State Assessments- Nebraska Educational Profile (NEP)

April is a time when staff, students, and schools experience varying levels of anxiety as we move into the "Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System," more commonly known as NSCAS testing. Spring state assessment monitors student progress in English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science. Students in grades 3-8 and junior students will, to some degree, experience their own "April Anxiety." All Juniors were assessed using the National College Board's ACT exams. ACT testing will focus on English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Writing. The Junior class took the ACT exams on March 25th. The Sophomores will take the ACT on April 23rd, 2025. The NSCAS exams will begin on April 1st and run through the end of the month.

NSCAS tests are high stakes for our schools, district and the community. As you know, these exams rate our student's learning progress in reading, math, and science against the Nebraska State Standards. Our goal is to have every student score "on-track" or at the "advanced" level on these examinations. The students and teachers have been working hard learning grade level curriculum all year and now the time has come for us to see what they have learned. The challenge for Maywood is that we are small in numbers, and a few high or low scores will influence the overall assessment scores.

As parents, I am asking for your help and cooperation during testing times by helping your son/daughter prepare at home. Examining the testing schedules, we have students testing almost daily throughout April in kindergarten through the eighth grade. Teachers will have students test in multiple sessions to keep them engaged and hopefully get their best scores. First and foremost, please help us get top performance from your son/daughter by making sure they receive at least eight hours of sleep the night before tests. Please put up the cell phones to allow them adequate sleep time. Secondly, make sure you require your children to eat a nutritious breakfast each morning. Thirdly, and most importantly take a few moments to positively encourage your children to do their best work on the exams. You play an important role as parents encouraging your children to strive to do their best by demonstrating their learning at all grade levels.

Why are these exams so important? The NSCAS exams are a "snapshot" reflection of student learning as compared to a set of state proficiency outcomes. Student grade level performance is reported in the AQuESTT State of the Schools report each fall. Student performance data is used to rank the schools as "Excellent, Great, Good, or Needs Improvement". School districts will be compared to one another by others. I want Maywood students to take pride in their learning accomplishments and reflect the level of learning that is occurring throughout our school. I am asking parents to discuss the importance of their children doing their best because it reflects the learning at Maywood Community School.

Alumni Announcement!

Lydia Fritsche graduated from Maywood in 2016. She is the 2025 Good Government Student Pharmacist-Of-The-Year Award recipient. Lydia Fritsche, the daughter of Mark and Cindy Fritsche of Maywood, is a pharmacy student in her final year at the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) College of Pharmacy. She will be the first Nebraska pharmacy student to earn this award.

Throughout her academic career, Lydia has actively engaged in leadership roles within the UNMC American Pharmacists Association -Academy of Student Pharmacists (APhA-ASP) Chapter, particularly in the Student Political Action Network (SPAN), and as a member of the UNMC Student Delegates.

Her commitment to advocating for policies that enhance patient access to healthcare and pharmacy services has been evident in her roles as UNMC's APhA-ASP Chapter Delegate, Policy Vice President, SPAN Committee Chair, and the College of Pharmacy Liason for the UNMC Student Delegates. In those roles, she empowered her peers to recognize their potential in shaping their professional futures and the importance of advocating for policies that impact their field.

Lydia has played a pivotal role in facilitating discussions among students regarding relevant issues, encouraging them to express their opinions to faculty and representatives. She organized field trips to the Nebraska State Capitol, allowing students to participate in the legislative process through testimony at open hearing and direct engagement with their senators. Her initiative in creating informative handouts, policy newsletters, and personalized guidance for students seeking to communicate with their representatives has been instrumental in fostering a proactive attitude among her peers.

Alongside her other initiatives, she also introduced a policy aimed at improving patient access to prescription medications. The policy garnered support from her professors and the Nebraska Pharmacists Association and successfully became a Nebraska State Law in 2023. An additional component of this law is slated for introduction as a bill in 2025.

The award will be presented to Lydia during the APhA Political Leadership Reception held during the APhA Annual Meeting held Saturday March 22, 2025 in Nashville Tennessee. The recipient received the following: (a) a \$1,000 cash award, (b) an award plaque, © a U.S. flag previously flown over the U.S. Capitol, (d) a complimentary meeting registration, and (e) five Political Leadership Reception tickets. The recipient will again be honored at the APhA-ASP House of Delegates.
