Happy New Year from all of us at Maywood Public School! As the new year begins, many of us are forming New Year's resolutions. Some educational resolutions landed on my desk over the holiday season so I thought I'd share some with you in the newsletter. This resolution focuses on reinforcement of a child's learning at home. I thought it had some great insight.

Reinforce Learning and Academic Skills in Six Simple Ways at Home

Incorporating learning into your child's time at home is one of the most important ways you can support success in school. Here are six easy ways:

1. Expose your child to new things. Every meaningful experience your child has—from observing a construction site to visiting a museum—has an impact on learning. On your next outing together, discuss how some of the things you are seeing relate to what your child is learning in school.

2. Have conversations about what your child is doing in classes. Show enthusiasm and interest. Find out what your child thinks about school.

3. Ask your child to teach you. Have your child show you how to solve that math problem on today's worksheet, or tell you about a historic event the class is learning about.

4. Talk together about all sorts of topics. Really listen to what your child says, and ask follow-up questions to keep the conversation going.

5. Encourage deeper thinking. Discuss similarities and differences between things. Ask your child to give reasons for opinions.

6. Put your child's abilities into action. Let your elementary-schooler use knowledge and skills to help you around the house. Ask for your child's advice when you are making a decision or solving a problem.

Maywood Driver's Education Class

Maywood Public School is proud to provide a Driver's Education Class for any student who is interested in taking the course. Maywood Public School and the Maywood School Board will be offering this class free of charge to Maywood students. The class consists of 20 in-class hours covering 19 chapters of the AAA "How to Drive" text and a written exam as well as 5 hours of individual drive time with the driving instructor and a driving exam. The qualifications students must meet to take the class is to have a state-issued School Learners Permit (SLP) by the time the driving portion of the class begins (approximately March of 2025). The benefit of taking the class is receiving a waiver for the written test and driving portion of the driver's test for a school permit and the driving requirement for the POP (Provisional Operators Permit). An additional benefit is that some insurance companies offer a discount on student driver insurance policies if a student has passed a Driver's Education class. Students can get a School Learners Permit (SLP) at any Department of Motor Vehicles Driver's License Examiner Office. Students must be 14 years of age, pass a vision test, pass a written test, provide proof of US citizenship or lawful status (a birth certificate), provide a valid social security number, and provide two forms which prove a principle address in Nebraska. Practice tests for the SLP can be found at https://www.nebraska.gov/dmv/practice/. Maywood's Driver's Education Class will start in January of 2025. Most classes will take place immediately after the school day (a schedule is currently being constructed). Upon completion of the 20 in-class hours, individual drive time will be scheduled. Drive time will be both after school and on some weekends.
